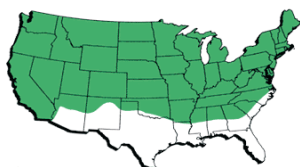


# TALL FESCUE

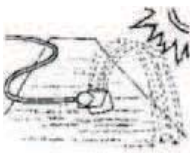


- Adapted to wide variety of climate and soil types.
- Good wear resistance.
- Moderate shade tolerance.
- Ideal pH 5.5 to 6.5

Type	Light	When to fertilize	Mowing height
Cool season	Full to partial shade	Spring and Fall	2 to 4 inches



Tall Fescue will grow in either partial shade or sun. It grows well beneath trees that shed their leaves in winter.



Even Tall Fescue lawn will become semi-dormant when the weather is hot and dry, but it will survive. Water is most beneficial in early fall when Tall Fescue is making new growth under dry conditions.



Tall Fescue responds dramatically to being properly fed. Fertilize it correctly and Tall Fescue will provide a dazzling green color most of the year.

## TIPS FOR BETTER TALL FESCUE

- Always use a fertilizer spreader to spread lawn care products evenly.
- In heavy clay soils, aerate established Tall Fescue lawns every 2 to 3 years to improve drainage and rooting. The best time to aerate is in the fall.
- Promptly repair damaged areas with fresh seed. The best time to plant Tall Fescue is in the early fall or early spring.
- Never mow too close. Close cutting weakens the grass and invites weeds. At the peak of summer, raise the mowing height to 4 inches.
