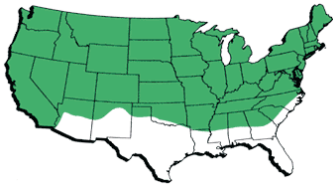


# PERENNIAL RYEGRASS

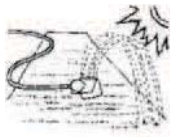


- Quick germination, rapid establishment.
- Good wear resistance.
- Uniform, medium texture.
- Ideal pH 6.0 to 7.0

| Type        | Light    | When to fertilize | Mowing height |
|-------------|----------|-------------------|---------------|
| Cool season | Full sun | Spring and Fall   | 2 to 3 inches |



Perennial Ryegrass needs plenty of sun to make a strong healthy lawn.



A strong Perennial Ryegrass lawn will survive periodic droughts, but if you want it to look picture perfect, you will likely need to provide extra water when the dry spells last longer than a week.



Perennial Ryegrass responds to being properly fed. Fertilize it correctly and Perennial Ryegrass will continue growing in areas that are often used for work or play.

## TIPS FOR BETTER PERENNIAL RYEGRASS

- Always use a fertilizer spreader to spread lawn care products evenly.
- In mixed cool-season lawns, repair damage to high traffic areas with fresh seed sown in early spring or late summer.
- In warm climates, Perennial Ryegrass normally dies out in mid summer. Reseed every fall to keep your lawn green through the winter.
- Never mow too close. Close cutting weakens the grass and invites weeds. At the peak of summer, raise the mowing height to 3 inches. Avoid mowing altogether when the lawn is stressed by drought.
